A New Way of Learning in Adani Schools

Six of our schools have just been declared India's first STEM Schools of Excellence by National Institute of Education, Singapore. This recognition isn't about rankings or scores, it's about a new kind of classroom, where students learn by solving real problems from their surroundings.

Instead of simply reading about electricity, students build solar lamps for their villages. Instead of learning coding in isolation, they design smart dustbins or irrigation alerts. This is STEM for Bharat, relevant, rooted, and real.

The journey began in 2022 with a powerful idea from Dr. Priti Adani, the visionary Chairperson of Adani Foundation: "What if learning felt more like living, deeply rooted in everyday life of our neighborhoods?"

Since then, with support from Temasek Foundation, and in partnership with NIE Singapore, our schools have gone through a quiet revolution - training teachers, co-creating a curriculum, and building something truly Indian in spirit bringing schools and communities closer.

Last month, 15 teachers spent five days in Singapore, where they explored everything from Micro:bit technology to sustainability projects and visited local schools. They returned not only equipped but inspired.

On July 13, 630 of our students took part in Technothlon, a national logic and aptitude challenge by IIT Guwahati.

It wasn't about winning - it was about thinking critically, working smart, and believing in their own minds. And that's exactly what they did.



When our students from Mount Carmel School, Ghugus, Chandrapur, managed by Adani Foundation travelled to Telangana for the National Open Kung-Fu & Karate Championship, they didn't just participate, they made a statement.

Out of over 730 participants, they walked away with:

- The highest number of gold medals
- · The title of Best Team

This win isn't just about medals - it's about confidence, discipline, and the quiet power of consistent effort.

In Focus: Adani Foundation's Shram Niketan School Shines at the Nationals







In the dusty lanes of Jamul, dreams often rise quietly. But this July, they roared loud and clear.

At the Sub-Junior National Grappling Championship held in Bilaspur, Chhattisgarh (July 26–29, 2025), students from Adani Foundation's Shram Niketan School, ACC Adani – Jamul scripted history. They returned with 4 Gold, 2 Silver, and 2 Bronze medals, a feat that stunned even seasoned athletes.

But there is a real story lies behind the medals:

These young champions come from some of the most underserved families, where proper training, equipment, or even a nutritious meal isn't guaranteed. Still, they showed up every day, practiced in open grounds, fell, got up, pushed through pain. Some fought through injuries during the championship itself. And yet, they didn't quit. They believed.

Their spirit was matched by the dedication of their principal and teachers and the consistent support of the Adani Foundation, which ensured they never felt left behind.
